Celebrating Nancy Leftenant - Colon

There are 100 words that could describe retired Maj. Nancy Leftenant-Colon, one for each year she has lived on this Earth. Most assuredly, at least some of those descriptors would include brave, steadfast, dedicated and trailblazer.

Born on 9/29/1920 to James Sr. and Eunice Leftenant. One of 12 children Nancy grew up in Amityville, NY.

Nancy became a registered nurse and joined the Army reserves in the mid 1940's. In 1948 Nancy was the first black woman to be accepted, commissioned, and integrated into the Army Air Corps. Nancy traveled all over the world as a flight nurse and served for years as an officer of the Tuskegee Airmen and held the presidency from 1989 – 1991. Nancy is the only women ever elected to this post!

Following military retirement (Chief Nurse, Major, USAFNC) Nancy returned to her hometown Amityville to continue public service as a High School Nurse which she retired in June 1984.
